

2024 Wetland Education Programs

Overview

In 2024, Inside Education was pleased to once again provide water and wetland-themed programming as a part of our suite of natural resource programs. This we offered spring and fall wetland field trips, as well as a PD opportunity for teachers that outlined skills and resources to assist them in leading their own wetland explorations. It was once again a highly sought after program across the province and we are proud to have engaged students and teachers in experiential learning at their local wetland, stormwater pond, or reservoir. We had the opportunity to visit lots of new-to-us wetlands with dedicated weeks to rural wetland programs, and were thrilled to make it through a field season with minimal disruptions from wildfires and air quality issues.

In Spring of 2024 Inside Education once again saw high interest for wetlands field trips, especially for the Grade 5 Wetlands Ecosystems program. Additionally we provided wetland education programming at the Spruce Meadows Leg Up Foundation School Tours.


The Participants - Fall 2024




Linking to Curriculum Objectives

Overall, the feedback received in the post-program survey indicates that our wetland field programs are achieving our organizational goals of providing cost-effective and curriculum connected programming. Teachers value the opportunity to bring their students outside and according to the survey, consider the wetland programs that Inside Education offer to be immersive, professional, well-organized, and connect extremely well to the curriculum. By using ponds and water bodies that are close to the school whenever possible, we inspire a feeling of connection to the community and the environment directly surrounding their school.

Walk in the Wetlands Teacher PD

In addition to our wetlands field trip programs, two one-day PD programs were offered to help support teachers who are interested in leading their own local wetland field trips.

The first PD was held in Edmonton on April 18th, and attended by **16** teachers from Edmonton, Edson, Goose Lake, Fort Saskatchewan, and Stony Plain.

The second was held in Calgary on April 23rd, and attended by **19** teachers from Calgary and Chestermere. At this program we welcomed guest speaker Renee Lazor, a member of the Living Lakes Canada team, to talk about their National Lake Blitz program.

Each program featured activities such as invertebrate dipping, water quality testing, and safety considerations such as what to look for in a good field site. After the program, teachers received a digital folder with a variety of resources that were discussed and used during the program to be able to use in their own excursions.

By having the tools to bring their students on a field trip, teachers feel more confident in connecting wetland education with their respective curriculums, recognizing some common wetland invertebrates, and the adaptations of wetland plants and animals.







Summary and Futures

Inside Education is extremely pleased by the uptake and feedback we have received for all of our 2024 wetland programming. Looking forward, we hope to connect water and wetland content with the Earth systems units in grade 4 and 5 in the new curriculum and continue to provide classroom presentations, teacher professional development events, and environmental innovation days to support student and teacher wetland education.

No matter the format, water and wetland education remains a popular topic area in Inside Education's suite of programming, and we look forward to continuing to teach and inspire the next generation of Alberta's wetland stewards!
